
"The music's good, and people actually get up and dance with the guy. That's been great," Nelson said.

Spring Village, which formerly was under the direction of the national Sunrise Senior Living Community, has been run by the smaller, regional senior-care network Woodbine Senior Living since October. Donna LaRotonda, director of community relations, said the change has been positive. "The change has gone over extremely well - not that it was ever lacking," LaRotonda said. "It's a very positive change. It's more hands-on leadership, a lot more giving back to the community and the residents versus Sunrise, which was a very big corporation."

Spring Village of Galloway is split into both a senior-living facility, for independent seniors who need little or no care, and a secure-memory facility for seniors who have Alzheimer's disease or other illnesses that require more care. Both were given holiday parties.
